A short-ish history of the Inter Club. The Withington have a long history of social inter club events, the first recorded such was versus the Irwell Castle which was held on Sunday 8th October 1933. Many such opponents have come and gone over the years but in 1987 the first event versus our old friends from the Dukinfield CC took place. 30 years on it's still going strong...........

1987

Club "25" - 12th April, 1987

We were blessed with another good day for this, the first of our Club "25"s. Plenty of sunshine, and not much wind. On the face of it a more attractive morning than the previous Sunday of our Open "Novices" and one to produce a batch of improved times we thought. But not so. It must have been a trifle harder, for of our four riders to finish the previous week, three "went back" a little.

The event carried with it the first of our Handicap awards — the Bert Jenkinson Trophy—and additional interest was occasioned by the fact that it was run as an Inter-club event with the Dukinfield and the Stockport Clarion.

Seven of our members faced Timekeeper Maurice and all finished. Simon Pearson, welcome back in the fold, was on scratch but as he had been suffering from a cold all week he could only manage 1.7.27. Greg Armshaw was fasted in the Club and second fastest overall with a time of 1.6.09 - a few second slower than in the "Novices".

The Handicap Trophy went to John Lowe, the only one to improve, with a ride of 1.8.48, and an allowance of 10 minutes. John had had the misfortune to break his chain in the second "25" last year, so he must have felt delighted with the outcome of this year's effort. Second handicap place went to Roger Godfrey, riding in his first-ever event and putting up a creditable 1.12.47, with 13 minutes allowance.

The Dukinfield proved to be the winners of the Inter-club, with an aggregate time for three riders of 3.18.12. We were second with 3.21.31, and the Stockport Clarion third with 3.26.29.

This event is the first of the three which count for the Harry Lloyd Handicap Trophy - the others being the second Club "25" and the M.D.T.T.A. "50". Now that some of our younger riders have had a fair amount of experience in the shorter distances it would be good to see several competing for Harry's Trophy by entering all three events.

If my memory serves me aright, it is some time since we had an Inter-club event. It seemed to me on the morning that there was a good atmosphere engendered throughout and particularly after the finish at the Headquarters, with lots of tea and cake (thanks to Nan and Edna). Let's think of having more of these Inter-clubs.

Altogether a total of ten members entered in this event and the "Novices", so I think we can look forward to an interesting season in the offing.
