
The Club Hill Climb as seen through the Withington Wheelers Club Journals



1952 ~ Cat & Fiddle

So the first Withington Wheelers Club Hill Climb on the Cat & Fiddle took place in 1952. As explained in the Journal of November 1952 (shown aside) it was a departure from the usual "dig and thrust" on Peaslows and was considered a roadmans climb.

Herbert Burton timed this inaugural event and made "the ascent the easier way by Anglia instead of a la Continental"

The Journal states that the climb was $5^3/_4$ miles whereas the current distance is accepted as 6.6 miles.

Only six riders entered the event, according to the journal the following were notable absentees; Ken Adshead, Roy Isherwood, Stan Foster and Lance Tulip. Once again it was Dick Worre who ran out a worthy winner riding a fixed gear of 77 inches. Alex Godfrey also riding 77" fixed came in second closely followed by Rod Slater riding "a variable gear". Handicapping was clearly a problem "with little (if any) previous data to work on" but in the end it was Rod Slater who won the handicap.

The other participants in the inaugural Cat & Fiddle Club Hill Climb were Jack Stant (24.09), Cyril Knott (24.49) and BJ Tetlow (29.12).

1951 ~ The first Club Hill Climb.

"Sunday September 30th, brought us to the Club Hill Climb, held on Standing Stones near Langley" reads page 4 of the October 1951 Journal (aside). Not surprisingly it was Dick Woore, who had finished second in the National Hill Climb only four years before, who put up best time, the only rider under two minutes with 1 minute $58^4/_5$ seconds. Jim Forbes came in second with 2 minutes $14^2/_5$ seconds and only $^4/_5$ seconds behind in the handicap. Various riders didn't make the top, finding themselves overgeared or skidding on the loose surface. One rider who did make the top was Rod Slater who had ridden a '25' up at Brock earlier in the day.

CLUB HILL-CLIMB, NOVEMBER 16TH:

This event saw a new departure --- figuratively this being the adoption of the principle of a roadman's climb as opposed to the usual short distance 'dig and thrust', and actually the Hovis Sports Ground at the Macclesfield end of the 'Cat and Fiddle'. It was thought that the different type of course would have resulted in a more popular event which would be reflected in a larger entry. However, perhaps the lateness of date had something to do with it -- so suffice it to say that six starters (five apparently willing and one conscripted) were despatched by timekeeper Herbert Burton on to the approx. 5% miles of twisting, rising, and - in one part - descending road. And all completed the distance to be timed in at the finish again by Bert -- who had made the ascent the easier way by 'Anglia' instead of 'a la Contimental'.

One welcome participant in the organisation of the event was, for a change, that indecisive person — the Weather Man. With bitter thoughts of the 'Open' in mind, it appeared that the said gentleman had repented of his sins and was indeed anxious to make amends. And certainly we could not have wished for better conditions, the wind being mainly favourable and the temperature 'just nice' (though undoubtedly warmer for the commetitors than the spectators:).

It was, of course, anticipated that Dick Woore would make fastest time, especially in the absence of Ken Adshead (now in the R.A.F.), Roy Isherwood, Stan Foster and Lance Tulip, although it was thought that our young trackmen might give him a good run. The first assuption proved correct, Dick returning the best time of 21.35 (a 16 m.p.h. average) and filling third place in the handicap list from the scratch mark. Jack Stant (who had been induced to ride by a mixture of persuasion and dire threats!) and Cyril Knott disappointed, and it was left to Alex Godfrey - riding a 77" gear same as Dick - to fill second place with a time of just over a minute slower.

Tith little (if any) previous data to work on, the handicapping presented something of a problem, but the results showed that the estimates were not far out. But even without working the figures out, it was obvious that the ride-of-the-day had been done by Rod Slater. He used a variable gear to good effect in taking less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ minutes longer than Dick to be third fastest and first in the handicap placings -- a nice effort which reaped its reward.

The occasion was followed by more fun-and-games in traversing the switchback roads to Langley. Some got lost, though only temporarily, and all eventually arrived in time for dinner, but where doubtless painful memories of a different kind of 'cat' precluded the usual inquest on the following result:-

CLUB HILL CLIMB, SEPTEMBER 6TH:

For the second time, the Cat and Fiddle road on the Macclesfield side was the secene of the Hill Climb -- and six contested the event.

It could hardly be considered a social occasion, for the venue is hardly a spectator's ideal, and supporters were conspicuous by their absence. A.J.P. had to officiate as pusher-off and guardian of the bits-and-pieces, whilst the Ford did yeoman service in maing fastest climb of the day -- seeing all off at the bottom and being at the top in time to greet the first man up.

Newcomer Coxon showed he could ride fast up a slope (for despie others' opinions, mine remains) to beat Isherwood by 22.6 seconds, with scratchman Knott in third place. For the occasion, Godfrey rode a special gear of 73" to make slowest time; presumably it was too low for him, or the hill was too high. Slater took a rise out of the handicapper to scoop the prize in the guess section.

The following year, 1953, there were again 6 contestants but last year's winner, Dick Woore, could only manage fourth place behind R Coxon (22.06), Roy Isherwood (22.29), Cyril Knott (22.52).Once again it was Rod Slater who won fastest handicap

Oh dear! Club Hill Climb, September 5th 1954. "Only one entrant – Rod Slater – turning up prepared to ride, there was no alternative but to abandon the event".

So there were no Club Hill Climbs during the years 1954 to 1958 but after a gap of five years the event resumed in the summer of 1959.

Dick Woore writes in the September Journal;

"If there was one thing obvious, it was that no new record would be set up under prevailing conditions, for the wind just blew and blew and in just the right direction to make the four riders really work for their living (for once!) Fastest both on actual time and handicap was our Editor who beat fellow scratchmen Lance by over a minute but had a narrow squeak in only having a six second advantage over Rod for handicap prize.

CLUB HILL CLIMB, JUNE 19TH:

The Hill Climb was poorly supported, not only by competitors of which there were four, but more particularly by Club members; other than the riders only three were out -- Arnold (on bicycle), The President as Timekeeper and Mrs. Mac. Where were the rest of the Club, particularly the juniors? Perhaps the reason, and we hope it was the sole reason, was that no start sheet was sent out and we had relied on the notice in the Journal which, unfortunately, did not give the time of start or other details.

However, five enetered, four rode and four finished.

Ken, who had been working all night, was sick on the way up but finished; Dick went up in fastest time, about four minutes faster than last year as a nice breeze was blowing from the west; Peter rather shocked us and scooped the handicap; Robert thought it too hot for hard work, until he discovered that Peter was on his tail and arrived at the finish MUCH too hot and bothered, but Peter screwed him down. The non-starter was A.J.P -- there being no one left at the start to push him off he decided to give Dick a chance. The result was:-

The Withington Journal from June 1961 states that the Club Hill Climb will be held on Peaslows (yes Peaslows!) on July 16th at noon. There is no further mention of this event in the Journals but in 1962 and 1963 the event did take place on Peaslows as follows;

1963 ~ **Peaslows.** The Club Hill Climb took place on Peaslows again a fortnight before the Open Hill Climb in October. The reference to the Club Hill Climb in the Journal is in the 'piece' giving the result of the Open..... "timekeeper Arthur Wood sent off John Rayner of the Withy. His was a good time 3min 4.2 secs – 25 seconds improvement on the club event two weeks earlier".

1964; No Club Hill Climb planned probably due to the National Hill Climb being held on Peaslows.

1965; "Due to unforeseen circumstances the Club Hill Climb was cancelled at the last moment"

1966; 'forthcoming events' in the Journal states Club Hill Climb will take place on 30th October 1966 but no result to be found in the Journals. There were no further Club Hill Climbs until 1979.

1979 ~ Cat & Fiddle.

"It has been many years since the Withington Wheelers saw a Club Hill Climb on the Cat & Fiddle. To be exact, it is 19 years ago. In November 1960 Dick Woore won with a time of 21.20 on scratch"

CLUB HILL CLIMB: CAT & FIDDLE, NOVEMBER 4th 1979. It has been many years since the Withington Wheelers saw a Club Hill Climb on the Cat & Fiddle. To be exact, it is 19 years ago. In November 1960 Dick Woore won with a time of 21-10 on scratch. When all the riders were in, Mac opened up his boot and the riders were given a cup of toa to stimulate their taste buds until we reached the Setter Dog halfway down the hill. Dad had already arranged for the party to have dinner at the Setter Dog so when we arrived we were ready for food. The food was excellent and everybody got together to discuss the morning's hill climb and memories from the past. After some more chat over a drink five of us left on our bikes to get home before dark. All the riders were on gears for the hill climb so we had a nice long "free wheel" down the hill into Macclesfield before heading off towards home. The full results November 1960 Dick Woore won with a time of 21-10 on scratch. The day was not bad fer the time of year with a favourable wind up the hill. To save any argument we put seven numbers into a hat and found out our starting order. Byrnie, who has been number 1, 2, or 3 in most of the events he has ridden, was hoping fer a different number. He was the last person to pick out of the hat and ended up with number. I! I was number 2, followed by Mike, Scott, Dick, R.E.Y.S. and Phil on number 7. At the start there were plenty of Club members beside the riders as riders from the Abbotsford Park R.C. were to follow us up the hill. First on the line was Byrnie, ready to take off. Five - 4 - 3 - 2 - 1 - go, he was off, closely followed by me. About a mile up the hill I caught Byrnie, who looked quite cheerful as if he was enjoying himself! (Laugh!) The next person I saw was John Gleave who had come out in his car. Ken and Flo then passed me and tooted to help me on. I did not see anybody else until just over a mile before the finish when Mac drove past to time us in at the Cat & Fiddle. Just after Mac had passed Eric Moore drove past and had to slow down when a lorry nearly pulled out in front of him. into Macclesfield before heading off towards home. The full results are as follows: 20-58.4 D. A. Slater S. J. Newbery R. E. Y. Slater 23-19.8 23-40.2 24-10.2 R. Woore P. J. R. Day M. G. Howarth 24-28.6 Cat & Fiddle. Just after Mac had passed Eric Moore drove past and had to slow down when a lorry nearly pulled out in front of him. Eric just managed to get past but there was not enough room when I got there. My brakes went on and I was delayed for a couple of seconds while the lorry moved away. The last stretch of road was ahead and in the finishing straight I sprinted as hard as I could until I had passed Mac's car. When a couple of seconds had elapsed I was back at Mac's car to find out my time, which was 20-58. Next in was Scott, closely followed by Byrnie. R.E.Y.S. and Mike beth sprinted it out together with R.E.Y.S. result 23-40.2 and Mike 25-46.4. Dick and Phil came in about a minute apart with Dick just beating Phil by a few seconds. R. Byrne Concluding part of May Whitbread's North American Tour, Beautiful Lake Louise is an absolute gem, set in the heart of the mountains with their snow-covered peaks, rising all around her, on

2nd November 1980. A joint event with the Abbotsford Park, we often clashed with them on the same date so common sense was applied and the two clubs raced against each other. Four Withington Wheelers against the Abbotsford twelve, David Slater finished top of the rankings with 27.37 (although seven minutes slower than 1979), Scott Newbery sixth in 30.37, Rod Slater and Dick Woore, 34.33 and 36.21.

"Over 1600 feet above the sea stands the lonely inn which boasts that it is the highest licensed house in England, thought there are other public houses which dispute this honour. The limestone dust lies thick on the road in front of the inn, half a dozen wagonettes and char-a-bancs, their blown horses sweating and steaming after the long drag up from Buxton, stand by the roadside. Down below on the Buxton road, clouds of dust show where others are ascending"

In summer, 'The Cat' is the favourite drive from the great Derbyshire wateringplace. One or two cyclists, white from head to foot, have pushed their machines up the final hill, and now mop their heated brows. Give me grit roads in preference to limestone paving."

That, let me hasten to explain, is not my picture of the current scene. It was, in fact, written in 1903 by a cyclist-cum-historian called T. A. Coward in his book "Picturesque Cheshire".

It is interesting to think that so many years ago cyclists were toiling labor-iously up this hill and suffering from the ill-made dusty road. These days we have a good tarmac surface. But the Inn stands just where it did then, as high as ever, and added to this, the riders this year had to suffer a cold easterly wind which buffeted them all the way. At the top, although the sun was shining deceptively, conditions felt Arctic.

High praise, therefore, to all who braved the elements this day - to our own four riders and to the Abbotsford's twelve. David emerged as fastest of all, and some idea of the tough conditions can be gauged from his time - 27.37 - which was seven minutes slower than his last year's winning effort.

Nobody wanted to loiter at the top and all, riders and helpers, were soon sweeping down quickly to the 'Setter Dog', where we again enjoyed good eats and convivial company.

In 1981 we again ran the event with the Abbotsford Park, the Withington filling first three places and David Slater sets the club record at 20 minutes 32 seconds.

Club Hill Climb - "Cat and Fiddle", 1st November 1981.

That a set of Masochists we must all bet We run two "Opens" in April and October which frequently experience weather more appropriate to mis-winter and then to cap it all, we have our Club Hill Climb at the 1600ft top of a mountain in November. We must enjoy suffering! I'm speaking, of course, of the helpers, not the riders. They at least create some body heat with their exertions and also enjoy that warm, smug glow which comes to those who engage in such activities.

To be honest, this year the weather was nothing like so unpleasant as last. Down at the start things seemed fairly reasonable but, inevitably, the "Cat" did its usual trick of producing its own particular weather; not the sub-Arctic conditions of last year but, near the top, a cold, dank mist through which we had to peer for each rider.

As last year, the event was run with the Abbotsford but this time they were able to field only two sales and a tendem, while we had five riders. Fortunately, the wind was favourable (I've never known the "Cat" without a wind) so that times were much improved over last year.

Once again David was overall fastest; as far as I can gather, his time of 20.32.06 is a Club record for the hill. Next came new member Doug Pate with a very creditable 23.07.02, just 20 seconds faster than Scott.

It was no day for standing about at the finish so we were all quickly away - down to The Setter Dog for good eats and pleasant company to round off another fine day with the Club.



"Don't miss this" exclaims the Journal, "Will David Slater come out retirement to win the Alan Bates Cup for the third consecutive year? He'll certainly



we'll never know whether the club record would have been broken but if pushed, you would have to say that Conrad's ride was certainly the fastest ride ever in the Withy Wheelers club hill climb. Perhaps next year we'll have a new club record?

Conrad's ride had certainly caught everyone by surprise, apart from perhaps Simon who's regularly training with him. Further down the pecking order, Howard, Rik, Simon and Scott were tightly grouped and were separated by little over a minute. Barry turned in an excellent ride to take the handicap by four seconds. 
2010 Club Hill Climb (Cat & Fiddle)

As you know, the club hill climb handicaps are always calculated using the winners time of the previous two or three years as scratch (for the 2007 to 2010 handicaps Steve Baillie was scratch rider but from 2011 Rik Meadows is scratch). As an indication of the improvement that these two have made on the tandem it is worth noting their handicap in 2009 was 16.08, for 2011 it will be 7.43."


It was good to see Scott turn up and give it a go, if he rides next year I'm putting my money on him to win the handicap! (The handicap in this event is based on the previous year's times).

Here's the full result of the Club Hill Climb held on the cat & Fiddle on Sunday 18th October.

Fastest on the day was young Tyler Koch, now racing for Mossley CRT (he's second claim to Withy Wheelers). Tyler improves every year, last year on a much better day he recorded 26.11, this year with the wind down the hill and everyone struggling to get anywhere near last year's times, Tyler went 23 seconds faster. Way to go Tyler!

So, trying to ignore the young prodigy (difficult I know to be soundly beaten by a 12 year old!), let's take a look at the Withy's, make no mistake this was a tough day even by Cat & Fiddle standards, wind against for all but a short section past the Shining Tor and a cold damp hill fog to greet the riders at the top. Everyone (apart from Tyler) went back about two minutes on last year's times.

Andy Harrison took his revenge on Howard (last year's winner) beating him into second place by 33 seconds. Interestingly Andy opted to ride on tri-bars. The faster riders often say that on the Cat & Fiddle, especially with the wind against, you gain more time going for a heavier aerodynamic bike than a lighter hill climb bike and Andy certainly proved this theory to be correct.

John Lowe surprised no one by running away with the handicap as his year by year improvement continues apace. Rob Kirk, in his first race up the Cat was unlucky not to get under 30 minutes but a great first ride none the less!

Behind Rob were a group of five riders only separated by 1 and a half minutes; John Newton, Alan Finney (both putting in great inaugural rides on the Cat), Tony Scallan, Brid Mcmahon and Russ Forbes making his comeback ride 15 years after his last ride up this hill.

Barry Norton, up from Peterborough for his final ride up the Cat & Fiddle (so he says, but I bet he can't resist it again next year!), Phil Butter and Norman Bradbury were closely grouped and separated by less than two minutes.



The Alan Bates Trophy

In the 1930s Alan Bates was one of the Withington Wheelers Grimpeurs who took the hill climb world by storm before their careers were cut short by the outbreak of war in 1939. Alan was unfortunate in that he only started competing in hill climbs in 1937 and hence only had two years before the war.

Alan was one of the victorious Withington team that won the team award in the Eagle RC hill climb on Bearda Hill in 1937. The other Withys were Alan Grant and Tom Frith.

This excerpt is taken from the chapter 'The Open Hill Climb and the Withington Grimpeurs' in the Withington Wheelers History.........

"1938 was the year that it all came together for the Withington Grimpeurs, we contested, in all, eight climbs including a memorable trip to the Catford, in those days recognised as the National Hill Climb. Taking our Open event on Peaslows event first, a point most worthy of note was the full start card of 100 names. Harry Batty of the Dukinfield was fastest in 2mins 47secs, Alan Grant in second place only $^2/_5$ of a second slower and Jim



Forbes fourth in 2mins 50secs. Alan Bates now improving steadily recorded 3mins $02^2/_5$ secs and these three easily took first place in the team race. In the Potteries event Alan Grant was fourth, Frank Stanfield fifth and Jim, riding all the way with a flat back tyre, was sixth. At Monsall, in the Derby Ivanhoe, Alan Bates also rode the whole distance on a flat.

And then came the mass assault on the Catford. Ten of our lads set fourth in two big Austins – seven to ride, accompanied by Charlie Haines, Freddy Wheeler and Walt Massey who went along to hurl encouragement. Admittedly we took no premier awards, But Alan Grant was seventh with 2mins $24^2/_5$ secs; Jim Forbes 2mins $36^1/_5$ secs (18^{th}) and Bertie Burton 2mins $38^4/_5$ secs (24^{th}) taking third team place. Alan Bates did 2mins 40s, Ken Perrins 2mins 51s, Maurice Laverick 3mins 06s and Tommy Frith 3mins 19s. Only the two Alans stayed with their machines in the Saddleworth and in the Eagle, Alan Bates was the best of our lads being fourth and with Alan Grant and Jim Forbes, took second team. In the Rossendale, another freak hill, we were again second team, Alan Grant also tying for second place. Noteworthy, was the Walton climb with five of the club in the first nine. Grant tied for third place, Alan Bates fifth and Bert Burton (6^{th}) at last achieved his aim of earning a first team medal."

Alan presented the Alan Bates trophy to the club in the early 1990s. Sadly Alan passed away in 2003.
